Heritage York presents a lecture series at the historic Lambton House, commencing Thursday, January 13, 2011.

The theme of the series is the history of York Township and its neighbours. Using various media, including slides, photographs, maps and other material, our speakers will engage and enlighten the audience with an in-depth knowledge of their topics and a desire to share it with you. Their passion will inspire you to dig further into Toronto's (and York's) past.

Lambton House is located at 4066 Old Dundas Street, just west of the intersection of Scarlett Road and Dundas Street West, on the east side of the Humber River.

On-site parking is extremely limited, but the Lambton House is easily accessible by 2 bus routes. The Warren Park 55 bus leaves the Jane subway station on the quarter hour and stops at the Lambton's front door. Alternately, from either the Kipling or High Park subway station, board the Lambton (30) bus to the Howland Avenue stop. A short walk down the stairs to Old Dundas Street, then a right, leads to the site.

The lectures will run from 7:30 p.m. – 9:00 p.m. each night. Refreshments will be available.
